

## April

Pima Community College students came to the CHUCK center weekly to learn the process of building wall panels.

PCC students learned traditional construction and started building a few small apartments behind the CHUCK Center that will be utilized for AmeriCorps volunteers.



## May

10 students from PCC finished the Spring semester, earning credit for their time spent at the CHUCK. A job fair was hosted on May 3rd.

Habitat for Humanity Tucson began bulk purchasing materials to be stored in the CHUCK Center's warehouse. These materials will be used in the upcoming housing production schedule in FY24.



## June

Pima Community College's carpentry class began a summer session on June 27th

The volunteer base has been increasing since the opening which has allowed us to continue the pre-fabrication of walls for upcoming builds.



## July

Habitat for Humanity Tucson has fully stocked materials for the production of 8 Habitat homes.

261 individuals have volunteered at the CHUCK since the inauguration, totaling 3,631 volunteer hours.

The AmeriCorps duplex moved into the roof sheathing phase.



## August

Second PCC semester kicked off with 11 students.

A win for women in construction: our class boasts approximately 2 women for every 1 man.



## September

Students have earned approximately 130 National Center for Construction Education and Research (NCCER) Industry Standard credentials through their hands-on labs and passing the NCCER online tests through training done at the CHUCK and PCC since Spring of 23.

We have other students that volunteer outside of a structured class, for a total of 65 students.



## Looking forward

We are in the process of certifying the CHUCK as an NCCER Accredited Testing Site. We look forward to offering classes through Habitat certified staff & PCC.
